

In the News

The Red Brigade terrorist group, which is responsible for the month-old kidnapping of Aldo Moro, has declared that Moro's questioning and "people's trial" are over. Moro has been found guilty and has been sentenced to die. It is not known whether or not Moro, President of the Christian Democratic Party of Italy, has been executed.

President Carter is understandably nervous about the voting this week on the second of the Panama Canal Treaties. The first, providing for neutrality of the canal after the year 2000, was barely passed; the second vote, to relinquish US control of the canal, will be as close. Carter feels the US will lose a great amount of prestige abroad and command of foreign policy if the treaty does not pass.
