In a compromise move to gain more votes for the second of the Panama Canal Treaties, treaty language was made to reaffirm that "in the exercise of our rights to keep the canal open, neutral, and secure, it shall not be interpreted as intervention in the internal affairs of Panama." Also decided was a provision which allows the Treaties to take effect only after implementing legislation has been passed or March 31, 1979, whichever comes first. Former President Richard Nixon won a major victory Tuesday as the Supreme Court declared that the 30 White House tapes concerning the Watergate affair would not be released to the public or any network. Nixon considered that the release of the tapes, played extensively during the trials of Mitchell, Ehrlichman, and Haldeman, would be an invasion of his provacy. An announcement today, possibly from the Red Brigade terrorists, said that kidnapped Italian leader Aldo Moro is dead. Authorities are searching for his body in a secluded mountain lake described in the announcement as his burial place.
