In the News

Yasser Arafat, head of the PLO, has softened his stance against Israel by indicating that he may accept the existence of Israel as a nation. He feels the only solution to a Middle East peaceful settlement is a Soviet-American guarantee of the "legitimate rights of the Palestinian people" and the "security of the borders between Israel and the neighboring Arab states", as declared last October 1 by the two superpowers.

Unlike the cool reception in March, the party with President Carter and Israeli Prime Minister Begin celebrating Israel's 30 anniversary as a nation was joyful and widely attended. Begin seemed moved by Carter's statements that the United States will always remain loyal to the independent nation of Israel.
