The long ordeal for Italy's Aldo Moro is over with the discovery Tuesday of Moro's body conspicuously left in a car on a Rome street between Christian Democrat and Communist party head-The cause of death has not been determined. Moro was the scapegoat for the quarters. Christian Democrat party and the ruling classes of Italy who were condemned by the Red Brigades for being anti-proletarian and for bringing Italy to near ruin.

David Berkowitz, the possible "Son of Sam" mass murderer, has pleaded guilty in New York Tuesday to murder charges instead of pleading guilty by reason of insanity. Berkowitz wants to add credence to his trial by a guilty plea so he can warn the world of the "demons" who led him to do the original acts of violence.
