According to the last apparent wishes of slain Aldo Moro, Italian government officials refrained from attending funeral rites Wednesday for the former leader of the Christian Democratic Party. The simple ceremony was attended only by Moro's wife, children, and other relatives. Moro had felt betrayed by his party during the kidnapping and wanted no remembrances from them.

After two years of separation, Princess Margaret and the Earl of Snowdon will end their 18-year marriage. The divorce will not affect Margaret's royal status. The princess has no plans to remarry at this time.
