With some senators cautiously approving, the Senate opened the way for a sale of warplanes to Saudi Arabia, Egypt, and Israel. Opponents of the sale fear for US - Israeli ties and Israel's security, while proponents stress the need for a balance of power in the Middle East and the advantage of a US friendship with the Saudis.

Wheat farmers will get a boosted target price for their crops of \$3.40 per bushel, an increase of \$.40, due to an emergency farm bill President Carter signed Monday. The increase hopes to replace lost profits from fallow farm land and will serve to keep our wheat competitive in world markets.
