Two photo analysts reporting to the House Assassinations Committee Tuesday gave further support to the original "single bullet theory" determined by the Warren Commission concerning President Kennedy's assassination. The experts judged that the "single bullet" could have passed through both Kennedy and John Connally considering both their seated positions. The analysts are also expected to judge that the firing came from behind the Presidential car, and that a sole gunman, Oswald, was responsible.
