

**In the News**

With the nine-day summit conference at Camp David nearing its end, President Carter cautiously hopes to seal an agreement on a peace-seeking outline for further negotiations between Egypt's Anwar Sadat and Menachem Begin of Israel. Until this conference, negotiations had been broken off between the nations of the Middle East since January of 1978.

President Anastasio Somoza of Nicaragua declared martial law over his embattled country Thursday as the national guard continued its fight against rebels trying to defeat Somoza. Over 400 persons have died in massive street fighting, but Red Cross workers have been hampered by close gunfire in giving their aid. Senator Frank Church (D-Idaho) suggested the U.S. withdraw economic aid in order to bring Somoza's early downfall.
