

## In the News

As the Camp David summit conference drew to a close yesterday, there appeared little optimism that there would be a formulation of what President Carter called a "framework for negotiation" for future attempts to settle the Middle East hostilities. Important areas of differences have not been resolved between Egypt's Sadat and Begin of Israel although both sides feel all issues have been laid open for discussion.

Electric and natural gas consumers may be shocked to find that those utility prices increased twice as much last year as the total increase throughout the years 1948 to 1973. A government survey determined the increase to be \$13.4 billion, 65% for electricity, 35% for natural gas. Fuel adjustment clauses play the villain for most of that increase felt by consumers.
