

In the News

In the wake of the Israeli-Egyptian peace summit at Camp David, brutal fighting has broken out between Syrians, based in Lebanon in 1976 to stop a civil war, and the Christian sections of Beirut. Since Saturday a tenuous cease-fire has been observed, supported by the U.N., the U.S., and Egypt. Israel has supported the Christian Lebanese but has been asked by Egypt to uphold the cease-fire.

Rep. Charles C. Diggs, Jr. (D-Mich.) has been convicted of 11 counts of mail fraud and 18 counts of tampering with his congressional payroll forms. Diggs holds seniority among black congressmen and founded the Congressional Black Caucus.
