

**In the News**

Middle East peacetalks will open formally in Washington on Thursday between the foreign and defense ministers of Egypt and Israel. President Carter will emphasize the importance the U.S. places on the hopes for peace by opening the initial talks. The dilemma of Israeli settlements on the West Bank and in the Sinai will have to be resolved before any peace framework is solidified.

A three-day-old cease fire in Beirut was threatened by serious sniper fighting at meeting points of the Christian and Moslem sectors of the city. Previously, Syrians and Christian Lebanese engaged in a 10-day war that has killed over 1,300 and wounded 2,000.
