King Khaled of Saudi Arabia, recuperating in Cleveland from open heart surgery, was visited Wednesday by Secretary of State Cyrus Vance. They talked of the cease-fire in Lebanon and U.S. hopes of the Saudis' continual help in keeping that peace.

President Carter's "most important domestic issue" went to the House Thursday after a combined House-Senate committee settled on the compromised energy tax bill. There are no primary tax increases, and Carter's tax on domestic crude oil and industrial use of gas and oil was eliminated. There are tax credits provided for home insulation, solar-heated homes, and industrial purchase of energy-saving equipment. Still to be fought out in Congress is the gradual deregulation of natural gas.
