

In the News

With the adjournment of the 95th Congressional session should come passage of President Carter's tax and energy proposals. A conference committee worked over the weekend on a compromise tax bill that would please Carter by settling on a tax cut much lower than the Senate's \$29.3 billion cut Carter called inflationary and outlandish. Already settled was a reduction in maximum capital gains tax rate for persons over 55. The energy package was nearly passed by the Senate but was delayed temporarily by various challenges by opponent Sen. Abourezk (D-S.D.).

On Saturday the 111 cardinals were sealed in the Sistine Chapel to begin the conclave that ends only after selecting a new pope to succeed Pope John Paul I, who reigned only 34 days. In pre-conclave conferences, there appeared no favorites. During the conclave, there will be 4 votes a day and no debates.

Arab foreign ministers are meeting in Lebanon south of Beirut to try to lessen the tension in the war-torn country. Nations comprising the Arab Deterrent Force (primarily Syria) have representatives at the meeting. Meanwhile, sniper fire and shelling in Beirut fail to make the week-old "cease-fire" a reality.
