In the News

- In a surprise announcement Friday, President Carter told reporters that the Middle East Peace Talks would be delayed temporarily. He said Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan and Defense Minister Ezer Weizman had been called back to Israel by Prime Minister Begin to discuss a new proposal by the United States. The news was unexpected since Carter had been insisting as late as Thursday that there were no serious problems. It is likely that the U.S. proposal concerns the future of the Israeli-held West Bank and Gaza strip and the possibility of eventual Palestinian habitation there. Egypt desires Israeli withdrawal from these two pieces of land over a period of time, a controversial subject that was not resolved during the recent Middle East Peace Agreement signed in Washington.
- Pope John Paul II, formerly Cardinal Karol Wojtyla of Krakow and the first non-Italian pope in 455 years, said Friday that all men are God's children. He called for religious freedom throughout the world yet was careful not to mention either the communist atheistic beliefs or the controversy in the Mideast.
- The controversy over the Firestone "500" steel-belted radial tire was resolved Friday when the firm agreed to recall over 10 million of the tires. It will be one of the largest recalls in history; according to Firestone Chairman Richard A. Riley, it "could potentially cost Firestone in excess of \$200 million." The investigation into the "500" tire arose following a number of serious accidents involving the tire, including several deaths.
