In the News

Palestinian Liberation Organization chief Yasser Arafat has condemned the peace plan worked out in Washington for Palestinian self-rule on the West Bank of Jordan and the Gaza strip. Arafat said that the PLO would fight against the plan "with all our potentials" and that "what they are offering the Palestinian people in Camp David is a new slavery for an unlimited period of time."

President Carter's anti-inflation program picked up a new ally in Federal Reserve Chairman G. William Miller, who called the program "a balanced, concerted and sustained program to fight inflation." Carter seeks approval not only from those who set the nation's interest rate policies, but also from business and labor, who so far like Carter's promise to cut government spending and a rejection of mandatory wage-price controls.
