In the News

Pravda, the official Communist newspaper, reported recently that the talks in Moscow between Foreign Minister Gromyko and Secretary of State Vance were productive and that a new strategic arms treaty might be signed soon. The newspaper warned, however, that American arms race proponents could ruin the treaty's chances of survival and called for a spirit of good feeling between the two countries.

- President Carter spent Sunday relaxing at Camp David after having campaigned for Democratic candidates in New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Maine the day before. At those campaign rallies, Carter announced that he had convinced Egyptian President Anwar Sadat not to have his negotiators recalled to Cairo. Sadat is angered by a continuing buildup of Israeli settlements in occupied lands. Israeli Prime Minister Begin has publicly defended the right of Israelis to settle in those areas. A "sickout" by employees of Pan American Airlines entered its third day, delaying many flights
- indefinately. Workers have been calling in sick to protest their lack of a contract for nearly a year.
