

In the News

Despite an 11 point drop of the Dow Jones Average yesterday, the dollar continued its slow recovery on international money markets. It made a 4% increase against the Japanese yen and also improved against European currencies. The partial recovery is due to the emergency economic plan which Carter announced Wednesday. Some provisions of the plan are 1) the loan of \$30 billion in foreign money to the United States in order to bolster our currency by buying up surplus dollars, 2) sharply increased sales of gold by the US Treasury, and 3) the increase of the Federal Reserve prime interest rate to 9.5%.

President Carter continued his campaigning for Democratic candidates yesterday in New York at a rally for Governor Hugh Carey. There he surprised reporters by announcing that he would meet with Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin later that day after Begin's morning meeting with Secretary of State Vance. Carter's meeting possibly was formulated to squelch rumors of ill feeling between the two heads of state after their disagreement on new Israeli settlements on the West Bank and the Gaza Strip.
