In the News

Over the weekend representatives were sent to Cairo from 20 Arab nations meeting in Baghdad with promises of vast sums of monetary aid to Egypt if President Sadat would renounce the Camp David peace agreements. Sadat refused to meet with the delegation; as a result, the Baghdad Conference will probably impose political and economic sanctions on Egypt. Rioting by anti-government protestors continued throughout Teheran, Iran, this weekend as fires were set in houses, hotels, and cars. Many students tried to pull down a statue of the Shah on the Teheran University campus; government troops were called in to stop them, supposedly killing 65. Later in the day, the rioters marched on the American and British Embassies, setting fire to the latter. The Iranian military has placed a dusk-to-dawn curfew on the city in an attempt to prevent the worst rioting in Iran in over a decade. There are more troubles for the beleaguered <u>New York Times</u> and the <u>New York Daily News</u>. During final negotiations on Saturday to settle the pressmen's union strike, which has closed down two of the country's largest papers since August 6, 1978, the reporters and editors of the Times also decided to strike due to a recent cut in their life insurance and health benefits. This turn of events will probably exclude the chance of the two papers resuming publication today as was formally scheduled.
