In elections for the 96th Congress last Tuesday, the Republican Party was able to ride the wave of public opinion in favor of lowered taxes and more government economy. The Republicans gained three seats in the Senate to total 41; Democrats control 58 seats. The Republicans also gained 11 seats in the House to reduce the Democratic edge to 277-158. The GOP picked up 6 governorships.

American artist Norman Rockwell died late Wednesday night at his home in Stockbridge, Mass.; he was 84. Rockwell was known primarily for his character paintings and his vignettes depicting the diverse moods, feelings, and dreams of America.
