In the News

Partisan groups immediately and forcefully criticized President Carter's attempt to curb future inflation by vetoing three bills he felt dangerous to the economy. Farmers disparaged his veto of a bill which would have limited his ability to import cheaper foreign beef. The textile industry disliked Carter's veto of a bill restricting lower textile tariffs. Student nurses lost a bill providing for huge sums for their training programs, a veto they called discriminatory. Carter responded by saying that "no part of our economy can be exempt if the nation is to reduce inflation."

President Carter has signed his energy bill, a composite of compromises that few feel will produce a strong national energy program.

In a nationally broadcast interview on "Face the Nation", Presidental aide Hamilton Jordan said that the President is considering presenting the US-USSR S.A.L.T. pact to the Senate as an agreement, not as a treaty. An agreement requires majority approval, while a treaty requires a two-thirds majority.
