In the News

The grim story of the mass suicides on November 18 in Jonestown, Guyana continues as over 900 bodies are being transported from there to Dover Air Force Base, Delaware for identification and burial by their families. The followers of the Rev. Jim Jones died by either voluntary or forced cyanide poisoning or gunshot wounds following an ambush of US Rep. Leo Ryan and a press crew in Guyana to investigate rumors of mistreatment and brainwashing of the cult members, most of whom came from Ryan's California constituency. Authorities now are investigating the legitimacy of the Jonestown settlement and the apparent paranoid dictatorship of Jones, spurred on by his "divine calling". Stephan Jones, the leader's son, affirms that his father was insane and held some members by force and others by demonic charisma. The suicides ended the belief of the followers that they had found a refuge and a life free from troubled responsibility. Yet Mark Lane, lawyer for the group and a witness to the deaths, claimed "they were smiling . . . " It is martyrdom beyond belief.

"It's like a souffle. When it's ready, it's ready — and it's almost ready," said Sen. Jacob Javits (R-NY) regarding the Mideast peace agreement. He and several other senators believe Israel and Egypt will reconcile their remaining differences over the settlements on the West Bank and Gaza Strip, but not before Dec. 10 when Begin and Sadat will be awarded the

Nobel Peace prize for their efforts to bring peace to the Middle East.
