

In the News

On Monday morning the mayor of San Francisco, George Moscone and a newly-appointed city supervisor, Harvey Milk, were shot and killed by former supervisor Dan White. The slayings apparently stem from the fact that White is a staunch political conservative and strongly opposed Milk, an avowed homosexual. Moscone was a liberal mayor and political foe of White. White had resigned from his position of supervisor on Nov. 10, 1978, saying that his \$9,600 salary could not support his family. On Nov. 14, White asked the Mayor to be reinstated but was refused, a decision urged by Milk. Mayor Moscone is the first American mayor to be assassinated since Anton Cermak, mayor of Chicago, was killed in 1933.

In the primary election for the presidency of the Liberal-Democratic Party in Japan on Monday, Massayoshi Ohira defeated Prime Minister Takeo Fukuda. The leader of the ruling party in Japan has traditionally become the Prime Minister, and Ohira is scheduled to take Fukuda's place in ten days.
