The House Assassinations Committee released incriminating evidence that Jerry Ray, brother of James Earl Ray, participated in a 1967 bank robbery in Alton, Illinois. The robbery was presumably a decoy to direct attention away from James Earl Ray so that he could follow, murder the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., and then escape. When questioned about the robbery, Jerry Ray invoked the 5th Amendment and said he could not remember the facts.

6 earthquake tremors shook Mexico City Wednesday, the largest of which measured 7.9 on the Richter Scale. Over 600 people were treated for shock or minor injuries. No deaths from the quakes have been confirmed, and damage to buildings was slight.

More than 2,400 citizens of San Francisco gathered in St. Mary's Cathedral yesterday to attend the funeral services for slain Mayor George Moscone. Later in the day, people paid their respects to former City Supervisor Harvey Milk at the San Francisco Opera House.

The San Francisco Chronicle reported that the man charged with the murders, former Supervisor Dan White, has confessed.

Firestone Tire & Rubber Co. has finalized the agreement to recall the infamous Firestone 500 tire which has been linked to numerous deaths over the last several years. The recall will take about a year and will cost Firestone over \$200 million.
