With the 112th Ohio General Assembly about to close its records, President Carter is angered by the lawmakers' vote of a 28% pay increase for all Assembly members. The Illinois legis—lature enacted a similarly enlarged salary for itself, much over the voluntary guideline of 7% Carter suggested for future wage increases. Carter feels these newly fattened pay—checks are a bad example for the rest of the country. Ohio congressmen argue, however, that the new salary of \$22,500, their first raise in 4 years, is just enough to cover expenses since they are allotted no expense account by the state.

The Moslem holy month in Iran, Moharram, was entered Saturday with bloody riots and protests against the Shah. Government armored trucks and soldiers fought the rioters in the streets. Then they cleaned up the bloody aftermath of what the Shah expects to be only the beginning of a month of heavy fighting and loss of lives resulting from religious fervor directed against the military government.
