In the News

Yesterday Pioneer-Venus-1 sent back its first data from the atmosphere of Venus, 33 million miles away. Sections of the space craft will descend toward the surface of the planet and radio back more detailed information of Venus' atmosphere.

The "Southern Crescent" train which derailed Sunday near Shipman, Va., killing 6 people and injuring 60 more, is reported to have been speeding. Tape recordings of engine speed show that the train was travelling at 80 m.p.h., 35 m.p.h. over the limit, when it met a curve in the tracks.

Dianne Feinstein was elected Mayor of San Francisco on Monday by the city's Board of Supervisors. Ms. Feinstein had been acting Mayor since last Monday when Mayor George Moscone was assassinated by Dan White, a former city supervisor. White has confessed to the slaying.

Pete Rose, formally of the Cincinnati Reds, ended his long contract negotiations yesterday by signing a 4-year, \$3.2 million contract with the Philadelphia Phillies. Rose is now the highest-paid player in baseball history.
