In the News

Soviet Party Chief Leonid Brezhnev told Secretary of the Treasury W. Michael Blumenthal and Secretary of Commerce Juanita Kreps on Wednesday that the Soviet Union wants an increase in trade between our two countries and a new SALT treaty "Without further procrastination." However, Mr. Brezhnev added that Soviet-American trade will continue to decline as long as the United States insists on tying trade to emigration and human rights issues.

Kirill Kondrashin, one of the foremost symphony conductors of the U.S.S.R., has gone into hiding in the Netherlands and has asked for residence permission. In 1972, Kondrashin was given the country's highest artistic award, but he claimed that his artistic freedom is being stifled in Russia. Once a director of the Bolshoi Theater and the U.S.S.R. symphony orchestra, Kondrashin just completed a 2-week engagement as the guest conductor for the Amsterdam Symphony. Kondrashin's wife originally defected with the director but has since returned to Russia and to her three grown children.

President Carter will meet on the French Caribbean island of Guadelupe on January 5th and 6th with English Prime Minister James Callaghan, West German Chancellor Helmut Schmidt, and French President Valery Giscard D'Estaing to discuss international affairs. Carter is also

scheduled to visit Mexico in February.
