1827 June 31<sup>st</sup> Arthur Tappan - One Thousand Dollars  
on condition that the sum of Ten Thousand dollars  
is made up for the object from monies not yet  
obtained, within one year from this date: and pro-  
-vided the nomination & approval of the person  
to occupy the 3<sup>d</sup> Professorship shall rest with the  
Rev<sup>d</sup> James Melroe, & the professorship be called  
by his name. To be paid as soon as the  
Professor shall enter on the duties of his Office.

Trustees of the Theo<sup>l</sup> Sem<sup>y</sup> of the Prot<sup>st</sup> Epis<sup>l</sup> Ch<sup>h</sup> of the Diocese  
of Ohio are elected every 3<sup>d</sup> year by the members of the  
Convention - none can sit in the Convention but  
those who receive the Sacrament in attestation of their  
Faith - - Here then is all of Security that the nature  
of the case admits of, that the person whom they approve  
of & employ as Professor shall be a correct Man
