

In the News

People throughout the world mourned the death of Golda Meir after it was announced last Friday. She had led a life of total political service to her country. Born in 1898 in what was then the Russian Empire, her family emigrated to the United States when Golda was only 8. Returning to Palestine, she became the Secretary of the Women's Labor Council. In 1934 she joined Histadrut which would become the Israeli government in 1948. At that time she was one of the 25 signers of Israel's Declaration of Independence; during the same year she helped raise over \$50 million for Israel's fight against Egypt, Syria, Iraq, and Lebanon. In 1956 she became the Foreign Minister under the leadership of Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion. In 1969 she became Prime Minister and led the country in the 1973 war. Golda Meir will be buried Tuesday in a spot next to Levi Eshkol, Israel's third Prime Minister and near the grave of Dr. Theodore Herzl, the founder of Zionism.

Cuban President Fidel Castro is initiating a new era of less restrictive government stemming from a feeling of more confidence in his own regime. In the spring of 1978, Castro opened the door to U.S. visitors and is now allowing the freedom of his political prisoners, most of whom will emigrate to the U.S. He is also permitting exiled families to return to visit relatives. Castro is indirectly seeking more concrete relations with the U.S., a fact which officials here have yet to fully comprehend and explore.
