Latest Egyptian peace proposals carried by Secretary of State Vance to Israel were met by a negative and absolute response from Prime Minister Begin. He indicated, however, that negotiations will cordially continue, but that no final peace agreement will be signed by the anticipated date of December 17.

President Carter has informed the U.S. public that our economy is sound and warns that recession is in our future only if we expect one and do nothing to prevent it. As a result, there will be a Joint Economic Committee hearing on the dollar dilemma and the failing international monetary system. Rep. Henry Reuss (D-Wis.) has suggested bolstering the dollar with other international money.
