

In the News

The political situation in Iran showed no sign of improvement yesterday when the Moslem religious leader, Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini refused to talk with a peace envoy sent to France by the current Prime Minister Shahpour Bakhtiar. There were new reports of army troops firing upon demonstrators celebrating the Shah's departure. Protesting oil workers remain on strike and threaten now to withhold all oil from domestic consumption. Meanwhile, in Egypt, Shah Pahlavi met with Egyptian President Anwar Sadat and former U.S. President Gerald Ford in Aswan; no details of the discussions were reported to the press.

The week-long strike by 100,000 truck drivers in England has reached drastic proportions as food supplies are dwindling throughout the island. Furthermore, industry has slowed to a near standstill, and exports have been halted. Prime Minister James Callaghan of the Labor Party decided against declaring an emergency today in favor of an appeal to striking truckers to allow desperately needed food supplies to move throughout the country.
