

**In the News**

Ayatullah Khomeini issued a statement to the Iranian people saying, "I will be in your service in a matter of days." He plans to return to Iran to formulate a Revolutionary Council in preparation for his Islamic republic. The so-called "legal government" appointed by Shah Pahlavi and headed by Shahpour Bakhtiar will be challenged. The military so far supports this government, but loyalties are wavering. A split between pro- and anti-Shah factions may be imminent.

There was good news on the domestic front last week: the Commerce Department announced that the chance of a recession in the first half of 1979 is all but non-existent since the American economy grew by the strong rate of 6.1% in the last quarter of 1978. The overall growth rate for fiscal year 1978 was 3.9%.
