In the News

Pro-government Iranian army troops fired into a crowd of anti-government demonstrators yesterday, killing 30 and wounding hundreds more. It was the bloodiest incident to occur in Iran since November. Meanwhile, in France Ayatollah Khomeini dashed any hope of an imminent Iranian settlement toward peace when he told reporters on Saturday that he will not meet with Prime Minister Shahpour Bakhtiar during his intended trip to France or anyplace else until the Prime Minister resigns.

Chinese Vice-Premier Teng Hsaio-Peng arrived at Andrews Air Force Base in Washington yesterday afternoon. During the evening, the Premier attended lavish Washington parties, celebrating his arrival. Vice-Premier Teng is in this country to discuss normalization of relations between China and the United States.

Former Vice-President and Governor of New York Nelson Rockefeller died of a heart attack Friday night. He was 70 years old.
