## In the News

President Jimmy Carter and Chinese Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-Ping concluded their third and final meeting at the White House yesterday morning. Both leaders used glowing adjectives to describe the talks, which ranged from Taiwanese security to S.A.L.T. and mutual trade. The two leaders will meet again today to sign agreements reached during the last two days. Then Teng will be scheduled to visit American industrial complexes.

The United States Embassy in Tehran issued evacuation orders for dependants of all American government personnel there yesterday. Officials fear a civil war may be imminent; Prime Minister Bakhtiar has declared that Ayatollah Khomeini will be allowed to return to Iran after 15 years of exile. Khomeini is still unsure as to when he should reenter his country. In national elections yesterday, white citizens of Rhodesia voted to accept the majority rule government worked out by Prime Minister Ian Smith and three black leaders. Under the conditions of the constitution, 90 years of all-white rule will end in Rhodesia, and blacks will be given voting power. Smith hopes this outcome of the national elections satisfies

American liberals, who have been urging black rule in Rhodesia.
