## In the News

Ayatollah Khomeini stoically returned to Iran yesterday to begin his struggle for power and the creation of an Islamic Republic. Speaking from a Tehran cemetary where over 1,500 of his followers are buried, Khomeini said that if Premier Shahpour Bakhtiar and his ministers do not resign, he will have them arrested. The religious leader also accused the United States of attempting to return the Shah to power; Khomeini pledged to drive out any of "the foriegn devils" that remain. Many Iranians fear civil war between the Bakhtiar government and the followers of the ayatollah.

Teng Hsiao-Ping concluded his 3 days of conferences with President Carter with only kind words for the U.S. and many vituperations for the U.S.S.R. He declared China eager to build upon this commencement of new cooperation and signed agreements with the U.S. However, he accused the U.S.S.R. of being "the main hotbed of war"; China seeks a "solid . . united action" from other major powers of the world against Russia, he said.

Newspaper heiress Patty Hearst left prison in California yesterday, following President Carter's commutation of her sentence from 7 years to the already-served 22 months. Ms. Hearst appeared in excellent spirits and sported a "pardon me" T-shirt.
