## In the News

Chinese Vice-Premier Teng Hsiao-Ping finished his tour of the United States yesterday by visiting the Boeing Aircraft headquarters in Seattle, Washington. Later in the day, Teng met with U.S. Senator Henry Jackson and told him that China will allow liberal emigration to help develop friendly relations with the United States. This move could clear the way for China to get a "most favored nation" trade status with this country. Teng returns to China tomorrow.

Iranian Prime Minister Shahpour Bakhtiar said yesterday that his government would allow peaceful religious opposition by the followers of Ayatollah Khomeini. Bakhtiar also said that he would "order the arrest - and execution - of those who call for civil war and the taking up of arms." These statements were his response to Khomeini's call on Saturday for the support of the Iranian army. Meanwhile, American military sources in Washington confirmed that Iran has cancelled more than half of the \$12 billion in military orders previously made by the Shah. This change of events is primarily the result of the dwindling money supply in Iran caused by the shutdown of the oil refineries.
