## In the News

Chinese Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-Ping arrived in Japan yesterday after his week-long tour of the United States. He met with Prime Minister Masayoshi Ohira to discuss Teng's anti-Soviet campaign. Ohira later made a public statement in which he said that Japan wishes to maintain friendly ties with all nations. Seemingly, the Japanese do not wish to climb onto the Chinese anti-Soviet bandwagon.

Calling for peaceful demonstrations from his followers and support from the Iranian army, Ayatollah Khomeini named Mehdi Bazargan as the prime minister of his new Islamic Republic. Iran now has two governments. Ironically, a friend of Prime Minister Bakhtiar, Bazargan is expected to name his cabinet within days, and a meeting with Bakhtiar to try to quell the civil strife in Iran is very likely. However, Bakhtiar terms the newer government "a joke."
