- The support for Ayatollah Khomeini and his opposition "interim government," led by Mehdi Bazargan, is growing daily. Yesterday, many members of the Iranian army chose to march through the streets of Teheran with the supporters of the ayatollah rather than those of Prime Minister Bakhtiar. Up to this point, the official position taken by the Iranian military has been loyalty to Bakhtiar. Meanwhile, the street demonstrators are calling for Bakhtiar's resignation.
- The protesting farmers who have been driving their tractors around Washington this week have hopes of airing their grievances and demands for higher price supports for their crops at a Senate Agricultural Committee hearing set for today by Senator George McGovern (D-S.D.). The angry farmers have been in their Washington "Tractortown" for three days.
