

In the News

The Supreme Military Command of Iran announced yesterday that it had abandoned support of Premier Shahpour Bakhtiar in his conflict with Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini. With Bakhtiar's only political ally now gone and rumors of his resignation and suicide being broadcast on radio controlled by Khomeini, the government of Shahpour Bakhtiar may be doomed. The way may be cleared for a takeover by Khomeini. Consequently, the United States military is preparing for the evacuation of over 7,000 Americans still in Iran. Passenger-carrying helicopters and marines have been moved into neighboring Turkey for this purpose.

President Carter will go to Mexico on Wednesday to meet with President Lopez Portillo. The primary topics of conversation between the two leaders will be the problem of illegal aliens entering this country and the sale of Mexican oil and natural gas to the US. The sale of Mexican fossil fuels to the US is becoming more important since 10% of our oil imports normally comes from Iran, which has had no exports since December 26, 1978.
