In the News

Since the fall of the Bakhtiar government on Monday, Iranian leader Ayatollah Khomeini and Prime Minister Mehdi Bazargan have been trying to restore order to the chaotic nation. Yesterday, they ordered the reorganization of the splintered armed forces and demanded the Surrender by all citizens of any weapons they might have seized during the anarchic final days of the Bakhtiar regime. Many people have not yet returned the weapons, and the ayatollah threatened yesterday to "out off the hands of traitors" who continue to terrorize. Former Prime Minister Bakhtiar is reportedly being granted protection by the new Prime Minister Bazargan who befriended Bakhtiar during their earlier days of opposition to the Shah. Bazargan has formed his cabinet of 7 men, many of whom previously held no political power, but who were active in the civil workings of the country. It is hoped these men can help put Iran on better economic and social footing.
