

In the News

Following Wednesday's attack on the American Embassy in Teheran, US State Department officials announced yesterday that they are planning a mass evacuation of Americans in Iran since their lives can no longer be protected. Of the 8,000 Americans now there, about 800 are expected to be flown out via 2 specially-chartered 747's on Saturday. American officials stated that they received assurances of Iranian cooperation at one point and then received a vague and uncooperative response from officials of Khomeini, putting all evacuation plans in jeopardy.

Abu Dhabi and Qatar, two members of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries announced a 7% price increase yesterday. Officials of both countries cited the increased demand for their oil caused by the halt of Iranian exports as the cause of the price rise. Saudi Arabia already has put a surcharge on the extra oil it produces. Many American officials in both the government and oil industry feel that an across-the-board price increase from OPEC is imminent.
