In the News

The outlook for the continuation of negotiations toward a Mideast peace darkened yesterday morning when the Israeli Cabinet announced that Prime Minister Begin would not attend a summit meeting with Egyptian Prime Minister Khalil. Egyptian President Sadat also declined to attend, saying Egypt has made enough concessions to Israel and will make no more. However, yesterday afternoon at his news conference, President Carter made a surprise announcement that Begin would attend the summit and will be in Washington tomorrow.
