In the News

Japan's Kyodo news service reports that China is preparing to withdraw from Vietnam after having secured Lang Son, a face-saving measure that presents "a military situation that would enable them to pull out." While Vietnam prepares to send reinforcements to aid the front lines, it also prepares to negotiate a cease-fire. Vietnam first demands China withdraw its forces before talks can begin; whether or not China first demands a Vietnamese withdrawal of Cambodia is still questionable. Meanwhile, Vietnam charged China yesterday with preparing to attack Laos, currently under a Vietnamese sphere of influence, and from Laos, to attack western Vietnam. Hanoi ordered a nation-wide mobilization of troops to prepare for the possible invasion.

President Carter admitted yesterday for the first time that recent talks with Prime Minister Begin at the White House have been unproductive. The two leaders met for 90 minutes later in the day but did not comment after the meeting.
