

In the News

Following the Israeli Cabinet's approval of the compromise treaty worked out by President Carter and Prime Minister Begin over the weekend, Carter announced on Monday that he would go to the Mideast on Thursday to discuss the proposal with President Sadat of Egypt. The compromise, although still secret, is believed to offer a fresh approach to the "linkage" problem: Egypt demands that the final peace treaty be linked to a Palestinian homeland in the Gaza strip or West Bank of the Jordan River. Yesterday, National Security Advisor Zbigniew Brzezinski and envoy Alfred Atherton met with Sadat. Officials of all three governments expressed optimism that a treaty could be signed soon.
