

In the News

Final preparation is being made for the formal signing of the treaty between Egypt and Israel. The historic event, ending a 30-year period of both cold and violent war, will take place today in Washington. Egyptian President Anwar Sadat and Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin are in Washington with President Carter, who has been the catalyst for the continuation of the Middle East peace talks and an essential to the solving of certain conflicts. Much celebration, including a sumptuous state dinner, is surrounding the treaty signing.

Sadat is very pleased with the new agreement but is still fighting other Arab opposition to the treaty and to the trust Sadat has placed in Carter and the United States. Syria called for "revolutionary violence . . . to strangle the Sadat regime" but has not gone as far as favoring an oil embargo against the US. Other Arab nations are threatening economic and political sanctions against Egypt.

Although a formal peace treaty between Israel and Egypt is to be finalized, much hot debate will occur over the question of Palestinian home rule. Both Egypt and Israel are predicting themselves to be tougher yet in these negotiations than they were in formulating the new treaty.

A message has been issued from former Prime Minister Bakhtiar, now in hiding, saying that the new Khomeini government has merely "replaced an old dictatorship with a new one, plus disorder and anarchy . . . repression, chaos, and a ruined economy." He bitterly criticized the upcoming March 30 referendum, a yes-no vote by Iranians on the formation of Khomeini's Islamic Republic. Bakhtiar refuses to vote since he is afraid of what an Islamic Republic may be and more afraid of what it may bring for the future of Iran.

The 75-ton space shuttle Columbia, carried piggyback atop a Boeing 747, arrived at Cape Canaveral, Florida, on Saturday. The orbiter is designed to make repeated space flights and will be operational as early as 1981. Kennedy Space Center technicians are eager to begin work on the manned vehicle; its first test flight will occur before the end of this year.
