

In the News

Oil ministers from the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) announced yesterday in Geneva that the price of crude oil will be raised to \$14.50 a barrel, a 9% price increase which will take effect on April 1, 1979. The result will be a 3¢/gallon rise in home heating oil prices and a 2¢/gallon rise in gasoline. The OPEC group also decided to allow its members to add premiums, or surcharges, to the base price. Some countries have already added surcharges of up to \$5/barrel. During the past nine years, OPEC prices have risen by over 900%.
