In the News

The downfall of Ugandan dictator Idi Amin appears to be at hand: invading Tanzanian military forces reached the outskirts of Kampala, the nation's capital yesterday, and there are reports that Amin has fled to northern Uganda. Exiled Ugandan troops, combined with Tanzanians, are also said to hold Lake Victoria and the town of Entebbe.

Fires broke out in two Boston hotels at 1:00am Thursday sending over 1,800 screaming residents out into the streets. The fires at the Copley Plaza and Sheraton Boston Hotels are believed to have been set by arsonists. Damage is estimated at one million dollars.
