

In the News

Harold Denton of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission told reporters at the Three Mile Island Plant yesterday that the hydrogen bubble in Reactor #2 had been "eliminated for all practical purposes". Experts had feared earlier that the bubble would hamper the delicate process of bringing the reactor to a safe, cold condition. Although officials admitted that more steps must be taken to shut down the plant completely, they have begun to notify residents of the area surrounding Middletown that they may safely return home. Schools will resume tomorrow outside of a five mile radius of the disabled plant.
