

In the News

In Groton, Ct., the first Trident missile-carrying nuclear submarine, the USS Ohio, was christened Saturday. Following on the heels of the worst nuclear plant accident in US history, over 3,000 anti-nuclear protestors were there chanting their disapproval.

President Carter's energy proposals, which include the deregulation of crude oil prices and a tax to avoid "windfall profits" by oil companies, were dealt a serious blow yesterday when Senator Jackson, head of the Senate Energy Committee, said that he opposed the President's proposed measures.

Teamsters and the trucking industry still have failed to reach a contract settlement, primarily due to disagreement over President Carter's voluntary wage-increase guidelines of 7%. The auto industry is being squeezed out of business temporarily since parts normally delivered by truckers have not been reaching auto assembly plants. Chrysler Corp. plans a virtual shutdown today until the Teamster contracts are settled.
