In the News

Palestinian terrorists staged a pre-dawn attack on the Israeli border town of Nahariya yesterday.
Slipping into the coastal town in a boat, they opened fire on the residents of an apartment house, some townspeople, and a police car. The raid resulted in the death of four Israelis. Later in the day, Israelis staged a retaliatory attack on a Palestinian naval base near Tripoli, Lebanon.
Tanzanian liberating forces pushed farther into Uganda, capturing Jinja, Uganda's second largest city yesterday. There was still no sign of fallen dictator Idi Amin.
