In the News

More unfavorable economic news was announced yesterday: consumer prices rose 1% in March, resulting in an inflation rate in the first quarter of 1979 that is the highest in four years. The estimated annual inflation rate is now nearly 13%. Leading the price increases were gasoline, up 4% in the first quarter, and meat, up 2.7%. President Carter also announced that Social Security payments will rise 9.9% in July to help those in lower economic classes to keep up with inflation.

President Carter sent his windfall profits tax plan to Congress yesterday. The plan calls for a 50% tax on windfall profits to become effective simultaneously with the deregulation of

crude oil prices on June 1, 1979.
